## **UK Position towards implementation of the HNS Convention**

You will wish to note that the UK has just published its formal public consultation paper on the national implementation of the HNS Convention. Subject to a successful outcome to this consultation and the approval of our Parliament, the intention is to ratify during 2004.

The consultation document initiates the first part a two-stage consultation process. The document just issued sets out the proposal that the UK should now ratify and the principles to be applied in the national regulations to implement the Convention into UK law. These follow the 'model' agreed at Ottawa and endorsed at LEG 87. The second stage will be undertaken early in 2004 and will focus on the proposed national regulations and the proposals UK reporting system to meet specific the treaty obligations.
